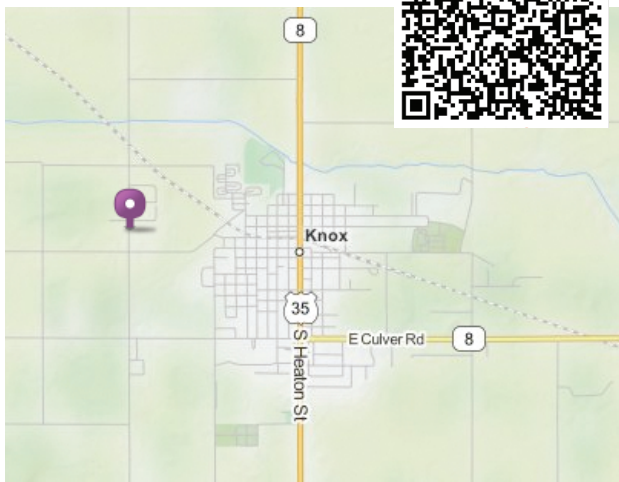


How do you enroll?

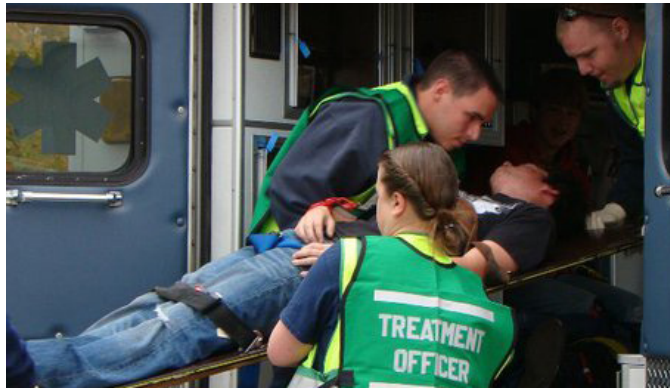
SCILL Vocational EMS Program

The **EMS Program** was created in conjunction with the **North Central Area Vocational Cooperative (NCAVC)** to enable high school students to obtain work-ready skills.

This **one-year** course is ideally designed for Seniors in high school, although juniors may also sign up and complete the course in one year to gain **certification**. High school students must be attending a high school that is either part of **NCAVC**, a ten high school, four county cooperative; OR if home schooled, must live within the school district of one of these schools. In addition, if a student attends a high school outside of the **NCAVC** district which does not offer this program, a student may also apply.

The EMS Program curriculum follows NREMT/IDHS, a national program taught in accordance with state and national guidelines. Upon Completion, students earn high school credits for graduation and can receive additional dual college credit (transferable) at no additional cost to the student.

Additionally participants will submit Clinical Rotations for Real Life Experience. The skills obtained will help springboard their career path. It will prepare them to enter the workforce or to seek advanced training opportunities to continue to perfect their technique and skills as EMS professionals.



Participants are instructed on:

- Medical Assessment
- Trauma Assessment
- Lifting and Moving Patients
- Managing Airways
- Medication Administration
- Splinting
- Bandaging
- CPR
- Operations
- MORE

Students will be exposed to internship opportunities with local businesses, which will help to further solidify their career path and increase their experience for employment after graduation.
